1. **ELIGIBILITY:** This contest is open to elementary schools within the Metro Vancouver. Your school does not need to have an established school garden. However, your school should be in the planning/preparation stage of creating a school garden (i.e. garden plans, planters, etc.).

2. **PRIZES:** Three schools will be selected to win a prize pack of Tried & True® ornamental and edible starter plants valued at \$250. Winning schools must be able to pick up prizes from our office at an arranged date and time.

3. **DECISIONS:** Each submission will be judged by unbiased members of our office staff (i.e. they have no affiliation to any school in the contest). Entries will be judged based on **originality, creativity, adherence to the topic, and overall fun**. Have fun with it! (*Odds of winning depend on number of entries received.*)

Prize pick-ups must be done as soon as possible to ensure the prime condition of the plants.
